New sightseeing flight in Danang and Hue in Apr 2019




This April we are excited to introduce to you our new day tours with sightseeing flight in Danang and Hue. See the former imperial capital of Hue as never before on a scenic 30-minute seaplane flight taking in Hue's UNESCO-listed Citadel and Imperial Enclosure as well as the coastline. Including the "fish mazes" of the 24km-long Tam Gian Lagoon where three rivers empty out into the sea.



The postcard-pretty coastline of Danang is even more spectacular when viewed from above. The 30-minute scenic flight follows the coast from the lush Son Tra Peninsula, home to Monkey Mountain and Vietnam's tallest Lady Buddha statue, along the Han River spanned by picturesque bridges, and down to the Cham Islands, near Hoi An.

Our tour to Phong Nha – Ke Bang National Park

Designated a Unesco World Heritage Site in 2003, Phong Nha-Ke Bang National Park contains the oldest karst mountains in Asia, and the distinguished Phong Nha cave with its magical beauty. Phong Nha Cave was formed by tectonic happening in the heart of Ke Bang limestone mountains hundreds of millions of years ago. The area is considered a paradise for researchers and explorers of grottoes and caves; so far only 20 of its 70-km total length has been explored by Vietnamese and British scientists.
